## Youth Worker Registration Information

This important subject keeps coming up over and over again, not just in Community of Christ but in every other denomination. We must protect our children and all who work with them.

The process that has been set up in Community of Christ requires that anyone who has contact with children or youth in any activities it sponsors **MUST** be a registered youth worker; this includes such things as teaching Sunday school classes, working with youth groups – helping out in any way, staffing camps and reunions, Vacation Bible Schools, etc. ANY contact with children or youth requires registration. That registration includes going through a training program. We have been working hard to comply with the process and will continue to do so.

Thanks to all who have been so diligent in getting this done.

We have been asked to get registration forms submitted 45 days prior to an event. This request is due to the number of times forms have been turned in to headquarters with only a two or three day window before a camp or reunion begins. This is not a sufficient time for the forms to be processed and recorded.

All of our priesthood members must be registered and trained by the end of this year. Please watch for training times to be offered throughout the Mission Center. If a congregation is planning to offer training sessions, please invite others from the Mission Center to join. If you have questions or concerns about this information, please feel free to contact me.

## 2013 Peace Colloquy


***The 2013 Peace Colloquy "Peace, Justice and Song",

Family, friends, neighbors, communities -- the world! They all need to encounter and experience Christ's Peace in a new way!



So the October 18-20 Peace Colloquy, in Independence Missouri, reaches out to you, inviting you to gather with others who are committed to bringing Christ's peace and ministries to our latter-day world.

The Peace Colloquy will focus on justice and peacemaking through worship and music as we celebrate the launch of our next hymnal, *Community of Christ Sings*. ## 2013 July Reunion

John Etcheson called us together for our morning prayer and testimony meetings. Many meaningful prayers and inspiring testimonies were offered each morning. John was assisted each morning by someone he had asked to give a lead testimony or prayer. These morning sessions were great experiences of worship.

Since the start of our June reunion, people have watched this live and recorded video site for 6000 minutes -- over 100 hours, learning more about what we stand for, and the Jesus we follow!

To find additional videos, continue scrolling down, to the "Video Library" tab. This shows 9 most recent videos. Click any of them to launch the replay.

To see even more, click in the "View All Videos" button in the lower right corner.

Note that these videos are NOT stored permanently! Our free service gives us "about" 6 months worth of storage. Sometime after that, especially if they're not being watched, the videos will be automatically "cleaned up" on the server, and no longer available for our use.

Our next live broadcast will be the October 26 BCMC Conference Worship Service. We hope you can gather with us in person at Salem, but if you can't physically get there, we'll invite you to worship with us on LiveStream! The conference itself will not be broadcast.

So please, help your congregational Recorder help you, by reminding them of these and similar events, and providing details. Your Recorder will know what questions to ask!



## Pastoral Response Teams

We are SO blessed in this church, to have "specialized" ministries available -- people with unique skills and ministries, that God put into the church specifically to be there when YOU need them!

BCMC President Joan Munter has organized six Pastoral Response Teams, in locations around BCMC, for use now and into the future, that are available anytime you have a concern about any topic! A Pastoral Response Team is a team of two ministers: generally an Evangelist and a Teacher, working together with you, to help deal with the complexities of life.

So, as topics or life situations begin to bother you, or distract you, feel free to reach out and invite a Pastoral Response Team to come visit with you. Life is full of situations when it could be helpful just to have someone to listen and help you on your journey. Many times, congregational ministers are available for that role; but other times, it may be helpful to have access to "outside" resources. Any topic is valid, but some examples of possible PRT discussion topics could include:



- Loneliness
- Congregational disagreements
- Grief due to loss of loved one
- Single parenting
- Kids heading off to college/empty nest
- Becoming a care giver for aging parents
- Family relationship challenges

John Etcheson has volunteered to serve as a "contact point" for anyone desiring to set up a confidential chat with a BCMC Pastoral Response Team. He will identify a team in your area, and help bridge the 3 of you together, to arrange a convenient time and place for a visit. You can reach John at:
